- It is normal that the temperature of the camera body rises if the camera works for a long period of time.

A digital camera is in a way very similar to a computer. If the digital camera hangs itself during operation, please follow the procedures below and most likely the camera can be re-activated.

- 1. Remove the battery.
- 2. Reload the battery.
- 3. Switch on the camera.

Getting Ready

> Turn On Or Off The Camera



- By pressing the Power Button can turn on the camera
- → By pressing again the Power Button can turn off the camera.

▶ Loading The Battery



- 1. Power off the camera
- 2. Slide out Battery Cover to open it.
- 3. Following the polarity indications and load the battery.
- 4. Close the Battery Cover
- ♦ The below symbols on the TFT LCD Monitor are the indication of the battery status.
 - (m):Battery power is full.
 - ():Battery power is half drained. Have new a battery ready.
 - (c):Battery power is drained. Replace with a new battery.

- → The battery may run out if the battery is kept inside the camera for a long time without using. Please remove the battery when the camera is not in use
- The battery may not work normally under 0° C or over 40° C. It's normal that the temperature of the camera rises after used for a long period.

Charging The Battery With The Charger

The battery is not charged when the camera is shipped. Charge the battery before use





- ♦ Charging Procedure
- (a) Insert the battery to the battery slot by the polarity
- (b) Connect the charger to the electrical outlet.
- (c) The LED will light up in red color when charging.
- (d) The charging is completed when the LED turns green.
- (e) Remove the battery when the charging is completed.
- → It is recommended to charge a new battery for more than 4 hours.
- → It's normal that the temperature of the battery and camera body rises after a period of time of using.

Getting Ready

▶ Inserting Or Removing A Memory Card



- Power off the camera
- Open the Battery / Memory Card Cover.
 Insert the memory card into the card slot and press it. down until a click sound happens. (Please press the memory card again to get it out once a click sound happens.)
- 4. Close the Memory Card Cover.

Formatting a brand new memory card is strongly recommended for first use.

+ The image(s) can be stored either in built-in flash memory or in memory card. When the memory card is inserted, the images will be stored in the memory card rather than the built-in flash memory. On the other hand, the images will be stored in the built-in flash memory when a memory card is not inserted.

Kindly note:

- → Do not support Memory Card under 128MB
- → When using 8G SD Card, the single file is up to 4G
- ◆ Playback result will be affected by different brand of memory card. Various delays might occur during playback HD file.

Button & Function

▶ Power Button



- 1 By pressing the Power Button can turn on the camera
- 2. By pressing again the Power Button can turn off the camera
- 3. If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera will power off automatically to save

▶ Shutter




Press the shutter button half way to do the focusing and then press the shutter button fully down to capture an image.

Buttons & Function

▶ Tele / Wide Button

Zoom in / Zoom out





- Push up the Tele Button, the Zoom Bar Indicator appearing on the top side of the LCD Monitor and it shows the current zoom status.
- Push down the Wide Button, the Zoom Bar Indicator will go back to the Wide view.

▶ Menu / OK Button

Menu / OK Button



- ♦ Press Menu/OK Button to go to the menu selection.
- When the menu is displayed on the LCD monitor, the Menu/OK Button is used or for confirming data.

▶ Function Button

D Up Button / ISH (Image Stabilizer Helper



In Menu Mode, press the Up Button ((())) to move up to the sub menu.



♦ Pressing the ISH Button (١١١) can activate this function

This function will only help to "reduce" the chance of blurred image due to unsteady holding of the camera.

Note

- 1. Image noise may occur with this feature.
- When you prefer the next image or movie clip not to be with ISH eature, please press the ISH Button (₩) again.
- It is suggested to use this feature under low light conditions when the object is beyond 3.0m from the camera.

Buttons & Function

Right Button/ Flash Button



- ♦ In Menu Mode, press the Right Button(♦)
 to move the cursor to the right tab.
- ♦ When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the Right Button (♣) operates as Flash function.

Down Button / Macro Button



- In Menu Mode, press the Down Button

 () to move down the submenu cursor.
- ♦ When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor the Down Button operates as Play & Pause function ,for play the voice & movie clip file in Playback Mode.



By pressing the Flash Mode Button (\$\frac{1}{2}\$) you can select different flash options as follows.

Macro Mode



- → The focus range is 10~60cm.
- A Macro icon will display on the LCD monitor when you select Macro Mode.
- ♣ Please press the Macro Button (♣) to cancel the macro setting if you prefer the next image in Auto Focus.

Left Button/Self -Timer Button



- ♦ In Menu Mode, press the Left Button to move the cursor to the left tab.
- When the menu is not displayed on the LCD monitor, the Right Button operates as Sefl-time funtion

Self-timer




- ♦ With the 10 sec. Self-timer (**):
 The image will be taken after an interval of 10 seconds once the DSC Button(**) is released.
- → With the 2 sec. Self-timer (5°):
 The image will be taken after an interval of 2 seconds once the DSC Button (5°) is released.
- · With the Double self-timer (ඌ):
 The image will be taken twice once the DSC(ජි)Button is released.
 The first image will be taken after 10 seconds and the second image 2 seconds after the first.



Playback Of Still Image, Movie Clip And Audio Clip





- ◆ Select the Playback Mode by pressing the Playback().
- The last image stored on the memory is displayed on the LCD Monitor and the Playback Mode will show still images, movie clips and voice clips.
- → Select an image that you want to playback by pressing the Left Button and Right Button.
- Press and hold the Left or Right Button to fast forward the images played.


Exposure Value (Default:0)





- ◆ In Shooting Mode and press Delete Button (
 ☑) to adjust the exposure.
- → Press Left/Right Button to set the Exposure Value.
- You can adjust the value of the exposure compensation which is ranged from -2.0EV to +2.0EV (at 0.5EV increment).
- Button to confirm the setting.
- The higher the EV value, the brighter the image will be.


ISO Value (Default: AUTO)





- → To adjust the ISO value, you will need to set at Program Mode and press Delete Button ().
- Press Right/Left Button to set the ISO Value and select the Menu/OK Button to confirm.

White Balance (Default: AWB)





- → To adjust the white balance, you will need to set the working mode at Program Mcde (②) and press the Delete Button (③) first. You can select the most appropriate white balance setting for a given shooting environment by "Custom" setting.
 - 1. Choose the CUSTOM setting
 - Put a sheet of white in front of the camera, and then press the shutter button.
 - 3. Press ok/Menu Button to confirm.
